



The Death Penalty in Bexar County

(As of January 1, 2018)

- New death sentences in Texas have **dropped dramatically** since peaking in 1999, when juries sentenced 48 people to death. Since 2015, prosecutors have sought death in eighteen cases, resulting in ten new death sentences.
- Overall, Bexar County prosecutors have secured **death sentences for 76 people** since 1974.
- While Bexar County is **Texas' third highest sentencing county**, it accounts for just one new death sentence since 2009. Between 2009 and 2012, death-qualified juries in Bexar County rejected the death penalty in four capital murder cases. The defendants were sentenced to life in prison without parole.
- There are **10 individuals** still on death row who were convicted in Bexar County. Of these eleven individuals, seven are Hispanic and three are African American.
- Bexar County accounts for **44 executions since 1982**. This accounts for third highest number of executions in Texas behind Harris and Dallas Counties.
- The last execution from Bexar County took place in July 2017. There are **no execution dates** currently scheduled in 2018 for individuals convicted in Bexar County.
- Since 1973, **160 individuals** – including 13 people in Texas – have been released from death rows nationwide due to evidence of their wrongful conviction.
- 9 people in Bexar County have been **exonerated of serious crimes** since 2011; many of those exonerations were based on perjury or false accusations.
- **21 people** sentenced to death in Bexar County have been removed from death row; in most cases, their sentences were commuted.
- It is widely accepted that Ruben Cantu was **wrongfully executed** by the State of Texas on August 24, 1993. Cantu's conviction was based largely on the testimony of a single eyewitness who later changed his story. Cantu's case inspired former Bexar County prosecutor Sam Millsap to speak out in his 2010 TedxSan Antonio talk entitled "Advocating for Truth: Why a Former Prosecutor No Longer Supports the Death Penalty."
