UPCOMING EXECUTIONS

Two executions are currently scheduled for 2024. <u>Ivan Cantu</u> is scheduled to be put to death on February 28 for the murders of James Mosqueda and Amy Kitchen in Dallas. He has maintained his innocence, and in previous appeals he argued his trial attorneys were ineffective for failing to investigate and present evidence that would support his claim. Disturbed by the prospect they heard false and misleading testimony during the trial, some of the jurors who sentenced Cantu to death in 2001 want this evidence to be reviewed.

Check your registration status, access a sample ballot, find your polling place, and more on the <u>Texas Secretary of State's website</u>.


